The Mannkal Economic Education Foundation has provided scholarships for one or two Notre Dame Students in 2008. The Mannkal Economic Education Foundation was founded by leading Perth businessman Ron Manners to support students interested in exploring libertarian and free-market concepts.

The Scholarship is either for one student, or a team of two students and is valued at \$5000 or \$7000 respectively.

The scholarship involves the recipient undertaking a Directed Business Project BS 391 unit and engaging in economic research in an area relevant to free-market/libertarian concepts. A typical topic for example would be investigating and reporting on the impact on business of proposals to implement stronger property rights in relation to expropriations by state governments. Another topic would be an economic analysis of the impact of Western Australian regulations of trading hours.

The scholarship monies will cover:

- The equivalent of the enrolment fees for the Unit BS 391.
- Travel and accommodation costs for the Liberty and Society Conference held by the Centre for Independent Studies in Sydney in 2008 or an equivalent conference.
- The balance to support the student's research activities.

This Scholarship may be of particular interest to combined Law and Business students.
